

Power Outages

The year 2014 has certainly started with a bang thru two significant ice and snow events hitting our state in the month of February. Mitchell EMC crews spent days helping sister co-ops restore power throughout the middle and northern parts of the state. Despite more than 330 crews from unaffected areas in Georgia and from at least seven other states, including Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Indiana, Louisiana, Florida and Kentucky, outages for almost 10,000 Georgians lasted for more than a week. Bills Spike

Mitchell EMC members have been fortunate that we did not sustain prolonged outages like others in our state. We are feeling the effects in our monthly bills, however. Many members' bills are significantly higher than this time last year. The culprit? Weather.

When you make no other changes in your household, but outside temperatures drop considerably, your heating system will run more. If you think your usage is higher than it should be, read your meter every day, about the same time, for a few days. You can easily track your daily habits to see if it is negatively affecting usage.
