Bridges, Glass, Hawkins and Williams recently joined three Youth Tour directors, 112 fellow delegates and 14 chaperones for the Washington Youth Tour, an annual leadership event sponsored by the electric cooperatives in Georgia, including Mitchell EMC.

The trip, scheduled this year from June 9-16, offered students a mix of



leadership and teambuilding exercises, history lessons with visits to some of the country's most treasured museums and monuments, and a rare opportunity to meet one-on-one with members of Georgia's Congressional delegation.

World War II, Korean War, and Lincoln Memorials.

Another teaching moment involved discussing today's top energy issues with members of Georgia's congressional delegation, including personal visits and photos with Senators David Perdue and Johnny Isakson and U.S. Representatives.

Students also practiced their social and networking skills by joining approximately 1,700 of their talented and ambitious peers and 300 chaperones representing 43 states.

"All of the delegates were friendly and inviting," noted Mae Manley, a 2015 Youth Tour delegate (Upson EMC, Thomaston). "I came home from the trip with more confidence and drive than I have ever had."

And in the words of another Youth Tour alumna: "The Youth Tour allowed me to really blossom and become more outgoing," said Hannah Warren, (Okefenoke Rural EMC, Nahunta). "I learned some great lessons on creating teams, friendships and partnerships."

This year, Mitchell EMC and other electric co-ops in Georgia celebrated 51 years of sponsoring students for the prestigious event. Since the first Youth Tour took place in 1965, more than 3,100 teens have been sponsored by EMCs in Georgia and given a rare glimpse into the country's rich heritage while learning lessons on the importance of contributing to a productive society.

Patronage Capital Refund

The Board of Directors of Mitchell Electric Membership Corporation is pleased to announce the refund of patronage capital for the year 1985. Members who received electric service from Mitchell EMC during 1985 may be eligible to receive patronage capital. These funds should be distributed in December.

As a member of Mitchell EMC, you are also an owner of the cooperative. The patronage capital (also called margins) represents equity or working capital and your ownership interest. The margins are utilized in place of borrowed money for a period of time to insure the financial stability of the cooperative and then returned to you in the form of a patronage capital refund. By borrowing less money and incurring less interest, Mitchell EMC saves money for its membership. The margins remaining after operating expenses are assigned to your account annually as patronage capital.

The retirement of patronage capital is just one of the unique benefits of being a member. As a member, you are a vital part of your cooperative and Mitchell EMC is proud to serve you.

Georgia Agricultural Tax Exemption Expires Dec. 31

f you're an agricultural producer and receive the Georgia Agricultural Tax Exemption (GATE) on electricity, you must renew it beginning this October.

GATE is an agricultural sales and use tax exemption certificate issued by the Georgia Department of Agriculture. The document identifies its user as a qualified farmer or producer who is exempt from sales tax on the inputs used in the production of their commodity.

Mitchell EMC member-owners who receive a GATE certificate should send us a copy along with the account numbers that apply to the GATE certificate, so we can apply the exemption to their account. We must receive a copy of the new certificate by December 31 for the exemption to continue.

Producers who have never received GATE can also apply and send a certificate copy to Mitchell EMC. Visit https://forms.agr.georgia.gov/gate/or call 855-FARM-TAX for more information, to renew or apply.

Turtle Pumpkin Pie

Ingredients:

1/4 cup plus 2 tbsp. caramel ice cream topping (divided)
1 Honey Maid graham cracker crust
1/2 cup plus 2 tbsp. chopped Planters pecans (divided)
1 cup cold milk
2 pkg. (3.4 ounces each) Jell-O vanilla instant pudding
1 tsp. ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg
1 tub (8 ounce) whip topping (divided)

Pour 1/4 cup caramel topping into crust, sprinkle with 1/2 cup nuts. Beat pudding mixes, milk, pumpkin and spices with whisk until blended. Stir in 1-1/2 cups cool whip. Spoon into crust. Refrigerate one hour. Top with remaining cool whip, caramel topping and nuts just before serving.
